What is Holistic Review?

Transforming Graduate Admissions Seed Grant

- Year long project
- Four UC campuses UC Davis, UCLA, UC Berkeley, UC Riverside
- Collaborator, Dr. Julie Posselt
- Faculty from humanities, social sciences, education and STEM
- Goal of developing an admissions model
- Meet every 2-3 weeks, sharing across campuses at a year ending Forum



Transforming Graduate Admissions Secret

- We were really considering the process *holistic review* for graduate admissions
- For a successful holistic review admissions cycle *powerful and nimble graduate platforms* needed
- Graduate admissions does *not* require a *rigid* review; rather requires Graduate Division to collaborate and coordinate with the many people and factors that influence graduate admissions outcomes

AMIGA Project Goals

- Foster and establish a lasting system of holistic review in humanities
- Develop and deliver faculty development modules on inclusive graduate admissions
- Disseminate inclusive graduate scholarship and practices at two Forums
- Revise graduate applications for graduate programs and potentially campuswide applications, that support equity, inclusion and holistic review
- Assess the adoption of holistic graduate admissions processes



AMIGAProject

- Focus on faculty development as key to inclusive graduate admissions with grad prog and Grad Division support
- Over nearly 5 years involve eight humanities graduate programs
- Each campus has faculty advisors, faculty development leaders and AMIGA campus committees
- Meet 23 times per semester admissions and policy experts, scholarship and share with colleagues
- AMIGA Forums in years and 4



Advancing Holistic *Graduate* Admissions

- Discuss equitable and inclusive graduate admissions with colleagues, chairs, deans, chief diversity officers, provosts and presidents
- Make the connection between,
 - diverse undergraduates → diverse graduate students → diverse faculty
- Share supporting scholarship and resources
- Promote holistic graduate admissions throughout admissions cycle
